#### CONDITIONS

#### SET 3. Programme management and resource standards

- 3.1 The programme must have a secure place in the education provider's business plan.
- 3.2 The programme must be managed effectively.
- 3.3 There must be a named programme leader who has overall responsibility for the programme and should be either on the relevant part of the HPC Register (for the following professions: arts therapists, chiropodists and podiatrists, dieticiaux, occupational therapists, orthoptists, paramedics, physiotherapists, prosthetists and orthotists and radiographers) or otherwise appropriately qualified and experienced.

The Programme Team provided evidence that the above SETS, 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3 have been met in full.

3.4 There must be an adequate number of appropriately qualified and experienced staff in place to deliver an effective programme.

#### **Condition:**

The Programme Team were required to provide Curriculum Vitae for the newly appointed staff members associated with this programme.

#### Reason:

- 3.6 A programme for staff development must be in place to ensure continuing professional and research development.
- 3.7 The resources to support student learning in all settings must be used effectively.
- 3.8 The facilities needed to ensure the welfare and well-being of students must be both adequate and accessible.
- 3.10 A system of academic and pastoral student support must be in place.

- 3.12 The resources provided, both on and off site, must adequately support the required learning and teaching activities of the programme.
- 3.13 The learning resources, including the stock of periodicals and subject books, and IT

facilities, including internet access, must be appropriate to the curriculum and must be readily available to students and staff.

The Programme Team provided evidence that the above SETS, 3.6, 3.7, 3.8, 3.10, 3.12 and 3.13 have been met in full.

### SET 5. Practice placements standards

- 5.1 Practice placements must be integral to the programme.
- 5.2 There must be an adequate number of appropriately qualified and experienced staff at the placement.
- 5.3 The practice placement settings must provide:
- 5.3.1 a safe environment; and for
- 5.3.2 safe and effective practice.
- 5.4 Learning, teaching and supervision must be designed to encourage safe and effective practice, independent learning and professional conduct.
- 5.5 The number, duration and range of placements must be appropriate to the achievement of the learning outcomes.
- 5.6 The education provider must maintain a thorough and effective system for approving and monitoring all placements

The Programme Team provided evidence that the above SETS, 5.1, 5.2, 5.3, 5.4, 5.5 and 5.6 have been met in full.
