Item 8.06/82 MINOR/MAJOR CHANGE: MASTER OF NUTRITION - UNIVERSITY OF NOTTINGHAM

- 8.1 The Panel received a paper for discussion/approval from the Executive.
- 8.2 The Panel noted that the University of Nottingham had submitted an application under the minor and major changes process, regarding the development of a second access route to the approved programme, which would allow appropriately qualified graduates to gain direct entry into year three of the programme. The development also included the creation of new modules, changes to a number of existing modules and changes to the existing regulations. The development was planned to take effect from September 2006.
- 8.3 The Panel noted that the Visitors and the Executive had reviewed the original submission and further information from the education provider, which had been requested to clarify a number of points. The Visitors had recommended that the proposed changes constituted a new programme, as there would be two distinct entry routes and the design of the proposed second route was based on an understanding that students had not studied many of the subject areas taught in the existing route.
- 8.4 The Panel agreed to accept the Visitors' recommendation and agreed that an approvals visit should be arranged to consider the proposed new programme.

- 9.1 The Panel received a paper for discussion/approval from the Executive.
- 9.2 The Panel noted that the paper summarised changes to approved programmes, which had been considered by the Executive and/or Visitors, in line with the major and minor changes process.
