Issues of Relevance to HPC

I presented an update report relating to the activities of HPC since the last COT Council meeting. The main topic of debate related to fees and issues around the White Paper.

Generally Council accepted that fee increase was necessary and that the process of consulting and informing members had been well handled.

In relation to the White paper there was, as expected, a great deal of discussion around the composition of the new HPC council. After some lively debate Council appeared to recognise the need for change and the principles behind the new system. There was much debate about the role and function of Council and the remit of committees and PLGs etc. I assured Council that they would be kept informed of progress in debates. I am sure the issue will be debated again.

Issues of registration and revalidation were also topics of lively debate.

Council also debated the reorganisation of university fees and the COT's role in the professional approval of pre-registration programmes.

Key Decisions Taken

Decisions were made in relation to the format of the new arrangements for student and university fees payable to COT in their role of professional body/WFOT approval of pre-registration programmes.

I feel it is vital that HPC maintains a good working relationship with professional bodies around this topic, recognising and facilitating the role of professional body kite-marking of pre-registration programmes.
