Business Process Improvement: Mr Roy Dunn

1. Human resources

No changes to BPI. The Operations Department PA has left the organisation and the replacement (Ruth Cooper) will be trained in ISO9001 auditing

Business Process Improvement and Operations have moved from the Mezzanine floor to a part of Park House.

2. Quality Management System (QMS) review meetings and internal audits

The internal audit schedule for 2011 – 2012 has begun.

QMS process updates

Work plan processes have been reviewed, and an updated project re-prioritisation process rolled out. Other project processes are being reviewed.

Work plans process has been updated.

BSI audit

The ISO9001:2008 audit took place on 5 April with our new auditor, John Doyle, looking at International Registrations, the whole Quality Management System function at HPC, plus workplace and IT provision. HPC passed the audit. Next external audit is scheduled for October

3. Business continuity

There are no changes currently other than monthly list updates. The 2011 exercise took place on the 27 May near Uxbridge (IT systems) and Sevenoaks (Business Continuity Management).

4. Information security management

Customisation for our cross-organisation information security training solution have been rolled out to all employees. 132 persons have undertaken the on line Cardinus Information Security training to date.

Further policy documents (ISO27001 deliverables) are in preparation. Templates requiring heavy customisation have been obtained.

A data audit will be carried out to capture possible areas of information security risk.

5. Information & data management

Test are being carried out to ensure the migration of the reporting databases from one server and database software version does not introduce any unconstrained variances.

6. Risk Register

The next update is being prepared for the September 2011 edition before being circulated to the Audit Committee, including the GSCC project risk register.

Specific risks around implementing HPC's actions from the White Paper *Liberating the NHS: Report of the arm's-length bodies review* and are included in the current published version.

7. Conservation of old CPSM registers

The first five registers have now been restored and they will be available at the Council meeting for members who are interested to see. It is proposed, gradually, to restore and conserve all of those that have been damaged.

Communications: Mrs Jacqueline Ladds

1. Media and public relations

Since the last report, we have issued a media release on the reappointments of the lay members to Council, a response to the Munro report on social care and to the Panorama programme on 'Undercover Care: The Abuse Exposed'. We have also updated our position statements on student registration, voluntary registers and the regulation of herbalists and healthcare scientists.

Six releases were issued on FTP hearings on strike off and suspension outcomes during this period.

For the month of April we had 63 mentions across national and regional media. This included 18 on general HPC issues, 6 related to social workers, 13 related to the regulation of Herbalists, Traditional Chinese Medicine practitioners and the Command Paper, and 19 in professional body publications as well as 26 FtP mentions. We issued 10 social media updates on key organisational issues as listed in our social media planner.

For the month of May we had 36 mentions across national and regional media. This included 2 on general HPC issues, 8 related to social workers, and 20 in professional body publications. We issued 13 social media updates on key organisational issues as listed in our social media planner.

The referrers' campaign has now ended. The closing statistics show that almost 4,000 doctors visited the microsite 7,180 times, an average of 1.8 visits per doctor with above average time spent on the site.

The Google adwords campaign is resulting in an average of 73 people a day clicking through to the Register and website. Our sponsored advertising on thomsonlocal.com and targeted Yellow Pages directory advertising continues. This is designed to encourage members of the public to check that their chiropodist / podiatrist and physiotherapist is HPC-registered.

Discussions and planning continue for a protection of title campaign with the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy, the Football Association and Markettiers4DC.

2. Stakeholder communications

Preparatory work for the three main party conferences in September / October continues. We are partnering with Help the Hospices and our fringe theme will be the proposed regulation of the adult social care workforce.

Working with the Policy Department we made a submission to the House of Lords EU Sub-Committee on the mutual recognitions of professional qualifications. Our submission focused on the current review of the Directive (2005/36/EC) and HPC's input to the professional card steering group. The Chief Executive gave oral evidence on 23 June.

We submitted written evidence to the House of Commons Health Select Committee on the regulation of the public health professions workforce. The submission updated the Committee on our current progress investigating voluntary registers and supported CHRE's similar investigations looking at quality assured voluntary registration.

The stakeholder team attended the Society of Chiropodists and Podiatrists (SoCP) Parliamentary reception on 7 June, which

provided a useful opportunity to meet the SoCP communication team.

Monitoring through Dods of the UK and EU Parliaments continues with many updates received concerning the 'pause and reflection' of the Health and Social Care Bill.

We attended the regular Alliance of UK Regulators in Europe (AURE) meeting, where discussions focused on the professional card project and the re-launch of the single market in 2012.

Structured stakeholder visits took place in Northern Ireland 17/18 May, Brussels 24/25 May and Scotland 13/14 June.

Meetings took place with the following individuals and organisations: Marina Yannakoudakis MEP (Cons, Spokesperson for Health); Malcolm Harbour MEP (Chair of Internal Market Committee); Emma McClarkin MEP (Rapporteur on forthcoming Green Paper); Pauline Mulholland, Lead Allied Health Professions Officer (NI); Andre McKeown, Communications Officer, Northern Ireland Social Care Council; NHS Education for Scotland; GDC Policy Officer Scotland; Nicola Gilray, Communications Manager, Scottish Social Services Council; SoCP Policy Officer, Scotland

Response to the July employer events in Liverpool and Birmingham has been positive. Both are now fully booked with approximately 100 delegates.

We also met the NMC Director for Scotland and Northern Ireland and discussed collaborative work at the devolved party conferences and the Member of Scottish Parliament researchers' event later this year.

3. Web

In May we received 31 internal requests for changes to the website and intranet. All requests are responded to within three working days, either informing of completed work or providing a timescale for completion. Examples of requests have included news items for the intranet and website, changes to content and broken links. We are also working with the Registration Department to update the FAQ section of the website.

The HPC registration logo was downloaded 168 times in May. There were no downloads from people not on the Register.

Deployments include an updated version of our events calendar for the website, enabling registrants to sign up for HPC events directly through the website, rather than having to phone / email. We have also introduced RSS feeds.

The new hpcheck website was launched on 13 June 2011. It includes an improved search form, clearer search results, the addition of suspended registrants appearing on the Register, and also a refreshed design and revised and up-to-date content.

We are currently working on the development of our iPhone application which is expected to be launched in July 2011.

4. Publishing

New and recently revised publications have included:

• an Easy Read version of How to raise a concern; and

• a revised and updated version of the registration renewal reminder poster for registrants.

We are currently working on the following publications.

- An introduction to our education processes (published July 2011)
- Council / Committee meeting mini-calendar (published July 2011)
- Annual report and accounts (published August 2011)
- Education annual report (published September 2011)
- Fitness to practise annual report (published September 2011)
- Professionalism and conscientiousness in healthcare professionals (research report, published September 2011)
- Revised / bilingual versions of the joint regulators' leaflet (date tbc)
- Report on the history of the CPSM (date tbc)
- Continuing professional development annual report (date tbc)

All publication requests continue to be dealt with within three working days. Publications of particular interest in May were:

- Standards of Conduct, Performance and Ethics (110 copies);
- Student guidance on conduct, performance and ethics (103 copies);
- Standards of Proficiency for dietitians (100 copies); and
- Continuing Professional Development (40 copies).

These copies are in addition to publications distributed at HPC events and external conferences. We received 59 requests from registrants for public awareness packs in May 2011. We are also including renewal posters and leaflets on promoting your registration in these packs.

Issue 35 of our e-newsletter HPC In Focus was published on Friday 3 June. The next issue will be published on Friday 5 August 2011.

5. Events

In May and June the HPC exhibited at The British Psychological Society Annual Conference, Primary Care, UK Radiological Congress and College of Occupational Therapy. During May we also had a speaking slot at the British Dietetic Association Annual Conference.

Meet the HPC events took place in Bradford and Sheffield with approximately 300 attendees. Our July Meet the HPC event in Canterbury is full and we are expecting 240 delegates for the two sessions.

6. Internal communications

The all-employee training away-day took place at the Royal Geographical Society in May with a focus on innovation and new business ideas. This was followed by an all employee meeting in June where an update on organisational projects was given.

Issue 14 of HPC Update was published in June. We are currently planning the September issue.

7. Communications work for organisational activities Transfer of social workers (England) Register:

For a more detailed update on communications activities, please see the paper entitled Transfer of Regulatory Functions from the General Social Care Council, Communications Committee, 22 June 2011. Two particular activities to highlight for this period are:

Following an article by Lord Hunt criticising the government's decision to abolish the General Social Care Council, we published a response on e-Politix outlining why we are well placed to regulate social workers. We have also arranged a meeting with Lord Hunt.

We attended the Community Care Live conference in May 2011, which was held in London. Here we participated in The College of Social Work's advice clinic and we also held a joint workshop session with the GSCC on the changing face of social work regulation. Community Care Live is a two-day conference and exhibition aimed at social care professionals and attracts over 2,000 delegates, most of them practising social workers.

Registration renewals:

Practitioner psychology renewals were completed on Tuesday 31 May, with a reduced number of registrants lapsing, 6.5% (1,117 registrants) down from 7.2% in 2009. We worked closely with the Registration Department and the British Psychological Society to communicate key messages to registrants.

Professional body renewal meetings took place with the British and Irish Orthoptic Society and the College of Occupational Therapists during June in preparation for their upcoming renewal and CPD audits. Meetings are also being arranged and held with professional bodies for the renewal of paramedics (due by 31 August 2011).

Name change:

We have appointed an external design agency to redraw the main logo, produce an English / Welsh bilingual version and a revised 'HPC Registered' logo, as well as a version of the new logo for online social media channels. The agency work is taking place now because the logo creates a number of dependencies for the project.

We now have a working draft of the HCPC logo which will be used to gather accurate estimates for the cost of making the necessary amendments.

A project initiation document (PID) is currently being drafted. Once accurate costs and timings have been gathered a project plan will be created and the project will be initiated.

Education: Ms A Gorringe

1. Approval process

The Department is coming to the end of the period of peak approvals activity between January – June 2011. There are currently 6 visits reviewing 13 programmes scheduled from June – August 2011. There are also 49 visits reviewing 54 programmes scheduled in the 2011 – 2012 academic year, from September 2011 – August 2012. The schedule of visits is now closed until December 2011, as we require six months' notice. As such, education providers also have until December 2011 to request a visit before July 2012.

2. Annual monitoring process

The Department is reaching the end of the peak of annual monitoring activity as we move into the summer months. Since the last Council meeting, the Department has held two further annual monitoring assessment days. These were held on 24 and 26 May 2011, with 8 visitors attending each day.

As no further assessment days are planned this academic year, it is envisaged that the majority of the annual monitoring visitors' reports will be considered by the Education and Training Panels in June and July 2011.

The most recent deadline for annual monitoring submissions was Tuesday 31 May 2011. The remaining submission deadlines for this academic year fall at the following times:

Thursday 30 June 2011 Friday 29 July 2011 Wednesday 31 August 2011

Monthly reminders continue to be sent to ensure submission of documentation from education providers.

3.

Major change process

Following the high volume of major change notifications received between January – March 2011, there has been a decrease in the

number of submissions as we move into the summer months. Since the last Council meeting on 12 May we have received 22 new notifications, covering 20 programmes.

4. Complaints process

5. Practitioner psychologists

A total of 30 out of the 33 required visits (91%) in the 2011 - 2012 academic year have been scheduled and we have until December 2011 to schedule the remainder.

6. Hearing aid dispensers

A total of 4 out of the 6 required visits (67%) have already been scheduled in the 2011 – 2012 academic year and we have until December 2011 to schedule the remainder.

7. Social workers (England)

Members of the Department continue to meet the General Social Care Council regularly and other social work stakeholders to discuss the transfer of approved programmes and implementation of our approval and monitoring post transfer, both of which are proceeding as planned. An outline of the planned operational processes was presented to the Education & Training Committee in June 2011.

8. Communications with education providers and stakeholders

Members of the Department met the following groups between May – July 2011:

9. Partners

Members of the Department have been involved in the recruitment and selection of chiropodist/podiatrist, paramedic, physiotherapist, radiographer and speech and language therapist visitors this month. Final interviews took place during week commencing 13 June 2011.

10. Employees

The temporary Department structure which has been in place since January 2011 became permanent in June 2011. Subsequently, Paula Lescott and Brendon Edmonds have been confirmed as permanent Education Managers. Osama Ammar will remain as Acting Head of Education Development until the end of August 2011, when he will be leaving the HPC. Recruitment for a permanent Head of Education Development and temporary Education Officer is likely to begin in July 2011.

Finance: Mr Gary Butler

1. General

Since the last Council meeting, the Finance Department has produced the management accounts up to April 2011.

2. Supplier payments

At the end of April, 98% by value of the £397K Creditor payments were in the 30 days or less category.

3. Fee adjustments and income receipts handling

At the end of April, there was no backlog in Registrant direct debit cancellations and amendments against a two-day backlog target. We had no backlog on rejected payments/refunds against a two day backlog target and no backlog on mid-cycle lapsing of registrants. The banking of registrant cheques is upto-date and there was no backlog on credit-card reconciliations against a twoday backlog target.

4. Income collection cycle

Direct debit collections of registrants' fees (cover approximately 80% of registrants) are processed by the Finance Department, with collections made two months in advance. Arts therapist, biomedical scientist, operating department practitioners and practitioner psychologist collections occurred in April. Chiropodist, dietitian and hearing aid dispenser collections were made in May and June. Most of the income comprises of renewal fees collected.

6. Pensions

In April, there were 66 active members in the Friends Provident.

Flexiplan pension scheme update: HPC has now had official notification of the operational financial charges for the Flexiplan scheme. From 1 April 2011 a monthly payment of £4,495 will be made as our contribution to the funding deficit. The latest update indicates that the test court case to determine the overall liability is not expected to take place until early 2012.

7. Employee training and staffing levels

There are eight full-time employees in the Department. Temporary employees are periodically hired to cover for employees on annual or sickleave and to help achieve Finance Department service level targets.

8. Sage system support and development

The finance team is working with TSG, our Sage service provider, to work through the details of the Sage accounting system enhancements. A new version of Sage is planned for later in the financial year together with PRS enhancements.

9. Significant financial projects/Issues (next few months)

- The purchase order product, PRS, has been reviewed by the finance team. It is planned to roll- out a new version of the product later this year at the same time as a new release of the Sage accounting system. PRS is a product of Sicon who are now a Sage business partner. This will improve compatibility between the accounting and purchase order systems.
- As part of the process, it is intended to visit another customer who is already using the new release of PRS to help identify the best use of new features.

12. Resources

Michael Demisse and Ewan Shears have joined the Department as case support officers. Both were formally registration advisors. Interviews were held for four replacement roles of Registration Adviser in May. Ashley Antonio-Mortley, Edolene Peters, Louise Devlin and Jasmine Sayeed were appointed and started work in early June.

5. Other HR activities Training

The HR team has developed an organisational training plan based on analysis of training needs identified during Annual Performance Development Reviews (APDRs), discussions with key departmental managers and with reference to the HPC's overall strategic aims. Courses will run from June 2011 onwards.

GSCC Transfer work

Work on the GSCC transfer continues to be a key area of activity. Recent work has included re-aligning the HR transfer project timetable with the revised transfer date of 1 July and identification a provider of specialist actuarial advice relating to potential pensions liabilities.

6. Policy work

As a result of recent legislation, the HR team is in the process of reviewing the HPC's retirement policy. We are also auditing a number of HR policies to ensure that there are no necessary changes as a result of the new Bribery Act 2010.

7. Employee turnover

Exit interview data has been analysed and the 2010 - 2011Employee exit interview report has been provided to the Committee in a separate paper. In 2010 - 2011 the overall employee turnover rate for the HPC was 11%, and the voluntary turnover rate was 7%. Table 1 illustrates how these rates compare with national averages:

Information Technology: Mr Guy Gaskins

Strategic objective 1 – "To drive efficiencies within the organisation by the use of information technology and information systems."

• Database upgrade

A project to upgrade a number of databases to a more recent version has started. This will ensure continued support for the applications.

The reporting database has now been converted and is being tested with our Information team.

Strategic objective 2 – "To apply information technology within the organisation where it can create business advantage."

• Fitness to Practise (FTP) Case Management system project

This project provides status reports to the FTP Committee.

The following pieces of work have now been undertaken:

- training strategy written
- testing strategy written
- UAT test manager engaged
- Net Regulate web service developed
- EDRMS configured according to specification
- scanning solution configured
- network architecture delivered into HPC's test environment
- logistics of training organised
- link testing undertaken
- backfill for UAT organised.

Four resources within the FTP Department have been allocated to undertake user acceptance testing and to write

the training material on a full-time basis.

The project plan is currently being realigned and it is likely that that the project will be delivered later than previously anticipated. This is due to a delay in the development of part of the system which has had an impact on the delivery of testing, migration and the preparation of reports.

The expectation now is for the project to be delivered in early 2012.

 NetRegulate platform refresh – This project aims to upgrade each of the separate platforms that NetRegulate is dependent upon to operate. This includes the operating system, database, application server and clients.

Initial development of the approach has been started and our database vendor has been engaged to plan the database upgrade.

A review of the project approach has been agreed with Digital Steps Ltd who will perform any changes needed to the application to make it work on the upgraded platforms.

The target implementation date for this project is the end of July 2011.

• Registration system upgrade (NetRegulate) – As part of the major project Enhancements to the Online Register the NetRegulate system was upgraded successfully to version 4.2.2 on Wednesday 1 June.

• **IT continuity file replication** – This project aims to improve the method by which we replicate files from our corporate fileserver to the disaster recovery environment.

We are looking to replace the current method with one that will reduce the time it takes to replicate files to the disaster recovery environment ensuring a consistent state if we had a critical failure.

Initial testing of the new service is positive.

The target implementation date is end of June 2011.

Strategic objective 3 – "To protect the data and services of HPC from malicious damage and unexpected events."

• Network encryption project – The new encryption product has been purchased and installed. The tool allows very granular control by user and by personal computer, called Port Control. It can be used to determine who is able to write data to removable media and whether it is required to be encrypted.

The Fitness to Practise (FTP) team will be the pilot group for this new functionality.

The pilot group has been identified and are having the software enabled on their PCs. The pilot will run for approximately two months depending upon feedback.

• **Credit-card handling** – Support the project to outsource credit-card handling to reduce organisation risk of fraud.

PCI DSS (Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards) expert advice has been sort to identify potential solutions and industry best practice for handling credit card payments by telephone.

There has been a delay to this project to allow for confirmation of how the reconciliation of payments will be achieved and to validate the exact requirements of our payment provider WorldPay.

The project has also engaged a PCI assessor to verify how HPC process credit-cards using two paper based credit card processes that have been identified by the project team. The revised target implementation date for the telephony solution is July 2011.

As part of this project we have moved telephony provider to OPAL (Talk Talk). This transfer was completed successfully on 5 May.

- Remote access security This project aims to improve the security provision for employees and external support organisations when they connect to the HPC services remotely.
- The software has been installed and is being tested by the IT team. This is now going to be piloted by the Fitness to Practise team along with the Network Encryption Project pilot.
- Blackberry disaster recovery service The Mobile Personal Mailing service has now become a business critical service. This project will investigate the options for

creating a disaster recovery service and if appropriate to implement the service. This will allow the Blackberry handsets to operate in the event of a critical infrastructure failure.

We have engaged with a specialist organisation to provide us with the technical options that we have open to us to provide a resilient service.

• Annual disaster recovery testing – The annual testing was completed on Friday 27 May. The tests focused on a hypothetical scenario encompassing three critical failures. A team comprising of members of EMT, middle management and the Chair of HPC ran the scenario in a new invocation centre in Sevenoaks.

The test was successful and also encompassed a standard validation of the registration system accessed from the invocation centre near Uxbridge.

• Penetration testing – Conduct quarterly independent penetration tests of our environment to assure adequate security controls. This penetration test combines both infrastructure and application testing. The testers initially use automated tools to probe the HPC infrastructure on a number of interfaces including the web sites and the online register and online renewal systems. The information from the probes is then used by the testers to attempt to manually circumvent the HPC security and gain access to sensitive areas or prove that a vulnerability does exist.

This test also includes the annual application test where a particular focus is paid to the web applications. This is

particularly relevant as we prepare to launch a revised online register website.

The penetration test took place in the week of 30 May 2011; we are awaiting the report.

Service availability Online renewals and online register outage – On Sunday 29 May an error with the Oracle database caused the outage of both the online renewals and the online register services.

Oracle has confirmed that this is a known error that will be rectified by upgrading to version 11.2 as part of the NetRegulate platform refresh project.

The online renewals and register applications were unavailable between 01:27 and 07:30.

Partners: Ms Kathryn Neuschafer

1. Recruitment

The following roles have been filled since the last report

- four arts therapist visitors (2xarts,1xdrama and1xmusic therapist).
- practitioner psychologist visitors (1xeducational and 1xoccupational psychologist).
- four registration assessor practitioner psychologists (1xhealth, 1xcounselling, 1xforensic and 1xeducational).

Unfilled roles from recent recruitment include registration assessor practitioner psychologist (counselling and health modalities).

Interviews are scheduled for the week commencing 13 June for visitor roles across multiple professions and a prosthetist and orthotist panel member following a mail-out of the vacancies to all registrants.

We are currently recruiting for the unfilled practitioner psychologist roles from previous campaigns and for the vacancies that have been created through the practitioner psychologist agreement renewals.

2. Training

Six new registration assessors attended training on 8 April. Eighteen new panel members attended induction training on 12 May 2011. Sixteen panel chairs attended refresher training on 7 June. There is a registration assessor refresher training session scheduled for psychologists on 16 June 2011.

3. Partner appraisal and assessment

Six Panel Chairs and thirty-seven panel members recently underwent a self-assessment in line with their agreement renewals. All panel chairs were successful in this process. Four panel members profiles failed to demonstrate an adequate understanding and application of the competencies resulting in non-renewal of their agreement.

4. Partner resignations

There was one registration assessor resignation during April. In addition to the above non-agreement renewals, there was one lay panel member resignation and one registration assessor termination in May.

5. Team information

Kathryn Neuschafer will be commencing maternity leave on 21 June for twelve months. Hayley Graham has been appointed as the Acting Partner Manager and will commence in the post on 11 July.

The Social Work Reform Board has continued to meet and recently discussed proposals for an assessed and supported year in employment. The Board agreed to recommend to Government that there should be statutory link between completion of the ASYE and continued registration. Once the Board's recommendations are finalised, a separate paper will be brought to the Council at an appropriate point.

At its meeting in June 2011, the Education and Training Committee also considered a paper about the HPC's future role with regards to training for Approved Mental Health Professionals (AMHPs). The HPC will inherit from the GSCC a statutory responsibility to set criteria for AMHP training and to approve AMHP training programmes against those criteria.

6. Independent prescribing

The Executive has continued to participate as part of the Department of Health AHP Prescribing Board looking at extending independent prescribing rights to physiotherapists and podiatrists who have undertaken appropriate training.

The Education and Training Committee has previously agreed that should such entitlements be introduced, the HPC would develop, consult on and publish standards of proficiency (or their functional equivalent) for the range of prescribing entitlements. These standards could then be used in programme approval and would complement practice guidance being developed by the Board for ownership by the professional bodies involved. Timescales for this work are currently unclear whilst Ministerial approval is sought by the Department of Health. Further updates will be provided when available. The Education and Training Committee has been considering a request that the HPC should own the curriculum guidance for independent prescribing being developed by the Board.

6. Service user involvement in the design and delivery of education and training programmes

The Executive has issued a research brief for a literature review and research with education providers looking at service user involvement in the design and delivery of education and training programmes. This research will inform a decision by the Education and Training Committee about potential changes to the standards of education and training. The research team is expected to be appointed in July 2011, with the results being reported to the Education and Training Committee in March 2012.

7. Voluntary registration

The Command Paper 'Enabling Excellence' said that the Department of Health would work with the HPC to explore the feasibility of setting up a voluntary register of social care workers. The Executive has undertaken a number of meetings in order to benefit from the experience of the Care Councils elsewhere in the UK who already register many groups of social care workers, many on a statutory basis. This has identified a number of interesting issues and perspectives that, in due course, the Council will need to consider. It is anticipated that a paper may be presented to the Council at a future point.

8. Impact assessment

The HPC's proposed powers to establish voluntary registers are subject to carrying out an impact assessment and consultation. The Policy and Standards Department, Chief Executive, Chair of Council, Secretary to Council, Chair of Finance and Resources Committee and the Chair of Audit Committee recently attended impact assessment training at the National School of Government. The training covered the principles, methods and approaches to impact assessment, with participants able to discuss how this might apply to issues around voluntary registration of professional/occupational groups and voluntary registration of students.

9. Annotation of the Register ('post-registration qualifications')

Following the recent consultation on the HPC's proposed approach, the Education and Training Committee considered a discussion paper from the Executive at its meeting in June 2011. It is anticipated that a further paper will be brought to the Committee and to the Council at their meetings in September 2011, with the intention that a clear statement of policy in this area should be agreed.

Registration: Mr Richard Houghton

1. Operational performance

a) Telephone calls

i) UK telephone calls: During the period from 1 April to 31 May 2011 the team answered a total of 11,972 telephone calls which is 4,619 more than the same period two years ago.

ii) International telephone calls: During the period from 1 April to 31 May 2011 the team answered a total of 2,067 telephone calls which is 651 less than the same period last year.

b) Application processing

i) UK applications: A total of 849 new applications were received during this period and 818 individuals were registered, which is 259 less than the same period last year. Applications were processed within our service standard of ten working days of receipt.

Applications for readmission were processed within our service standard of ten working days of receipt.

ii) International applications: A total of 280 new international applications were received in this period and 332 individuals were registered which is 121 more than the same period last year.

iii) Grandparenting applications: A total of 15 new grandparenting applications were received in this period and 3 individuals were registered which is 6 less than the same period

i) UK emails: The team received approximately 100 emails per day and responded to these on average within one day of receipt which is within our service standard of 48 hours.

ii) International emails: The team received approximately 20 emails per day and managed to respond to these on average within two days of receipt which meets our service standard of 48 hours response time.

d) Continuing Professional Development (CPD) audit

The last remaining assessments of operating department practitioner's CPD profiles continued to be performed during this period.

e) Registration renewals

At the start of March 2011 all registered practitioner psychologists were invited to renew their registration for the next two-year cycle. This year a record total of 93.5% successfully renewed their registration for the next two-year cycle, which is an improvement of 0.7% compared to the last renewal period. A total of 54.3% of registered practitioner psychologists renewed online.

2. Resource

a) Employees

The Department is operating within the budgeted headcount.

Secretariat: Miss Louise Hart

1. Fitness to practise seminar

On 26 May, following the meeting of the Fitness to Practise Committee, a stakeholder event was held to discuss alternative mechanisms for resolving disputes. Key stakeholders were invited to Park House to discuss the literature review carried out by the University of Strathclyde on behalf of the HPC.

The event was well-attended and the feedback received will inform the work of the Executive going forward.

2. Appointment of Council members

The appointment process to recruit two registrant members of Council is due to conclude on 30 June with the recommendations of the panel to be considered by the Health and Social Care Appointments Committee in early July. We will be welcoming our two new registrant members at Council on 7 July 2011.

3. Annual meeting

Last year, the decision was made to hold the annual meeting in one of the other three countries. The event was held in Scotland and the turnout and feedback were positive. It has been agreed that we should hold the event at Park House this year and, going forward, alternate with the other three country venues biannually. All Council members are asked to stay on for this event which will conclude no later than 4pm.

4. New calendar

The mini calendar of Council and Committee meeting dates for 2011 – 2012 has now been printed and copies will be made available at the Council meeting. Further copies are available from the Secretariat.

5. Committee appointments

Committee appointments were last made in July 2009 all for terms of two years. As you will see from the paper on today's agenda, it was not possible to determine Committee membership for our new registrant members in the timeframe provided under the appointments process. This exercise will therefore be undertaken over the course of the summer and this will provide an opportunity to review committee membership of existing members. Whilst no major changes are expected, we do need to be mindful of the skill requirements and needs of Committees and so there may be a degree of change. Should any member wish to be considered for appointment to an alternative Committee, please contact the Secretariat.

6. Awayday

Arrangements for this year's awayday (19 - 20 October) to be held at the Quay Hotel, Deganwy, North Wales are in hand. Secretariat will be co-ordinating transportation and will be in touch as soon as the train companies have released tickets for these dates.

Number of registrants with supplementary prescribing rights April 2010 - March 2012






