Executive Summary

Council member workshop survey

Members of Council responded to a brief survey on the benefits of Council workshop sessions and future planning for these. The following summarises the responses received.

Value of workshops

For members

- Relationship building informal co-working and exchange of ideas with the Executive and other members.
- Improving decision making more informed individually and as a board.
- An opportunity to explore external perspectives.
- More in depth discussions than a formal agenda would allow for.

For the HCPC

- Space for exploration of long-term issues
- Enables Council to think strategically.
- Providing Executive with an early steer on Council member thinking on a particular issue.
- Sharing knowledge between Members and the Executive, building trust.

Proposed topics will inform the planning of future sessions.

The majority of respondents preferred sessions to be held the afternoon before a morning Council meeting, at a frequency of three sessions a year. This has been reflected in meeting schedule for 2020 Council and Committee dates, which is to note later on the meeting agenda.

Online learning

Some of the suggested development topics could be effectively delivered through the HCPC's learning and development portal, currently in use for Employees and Partners. Council member access and use of this system will be explored with the HR team with an aim of complementing the face to face workshop sessions.

October Council awayday

The HCPC intended to hold a stakeholder forum in Wales in September 2019, which would include participation from some members of Council. However, considering the need to minimise expenditure where possible, it is proposed that the Council event be held in the HCPC's offices this year.

It is anticipated that the event will start in the early afternoon of the 23 October with a session with the SMT on board dynamics using the previously discussed Facet 5 methodology. This will be followed by a Council and SMT dinner. A Council meeting and additional workshop activity to be determined will be held on 24 October.

In preparation for the Facet 5 session members will be asked to undertake a personal profile which includes a full debrief session with a practitioner. This will be arranged for September 2019.
