HPC ANNUAL MONITORING AUDITS FOR APPROVAL

Executive Summary and Recommendations

1. Introduction

The HPC annual monitoring cycle involves two types of monitoring submissions (audit and declaration). Education providers have been divided into group A and group B. In 2007, all programmes that are in group A need to complete an audit form and submit it with their internal quality reports and external examiners' reports from the last two academic years. Education providers are expected to submit these monitoring submissions to HPC within 28 days of their institution's own internal annual monitoring process.

Three annual monitoring assessment days have been held on 20 February 2007, 20 April 2007, 22 May 2007 and 3 July 2007 to consider some submissions from programmes in Group A. As a result of these assessment days and follow-up work, Visitors have recommended that the programmes listed below continue to meet the standards of education and training and that upon successful completion, students continue to meet the standards of proficiency.
