Item 1.07/49 APPOINTMENT OF PANEL CHAIRMAN

1.1 The Panel agreed that Mr McFadden should act as Chairman for the meeting.

Item 2.07/50 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

2.1 There were no apologies for absence.

Item 3.07/51 APPROVAL OF AGENDA

3.1 The Panel approved the agenda.

Item 4.07/52 UNCONFIRMED MINUTES OF THE EDUCATION AND TRAINING PANEL HELD ON 31 MAY 2007

4.1 It was agreed that the minutes of the third meeting of the Education and Training Panel should be confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

Item 5.07/53 MATTERS ARISING

- 5.1 The Panel received a paper to note from the Executive.
- 5.2 The Panel noted that the action points arising from the previous meeting had been addressed, except for action point 2, where the Executive were in the process of notifying education providers of programme approval.

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5.3 The Panel noted that Visitors' reports for approved programmes were sometimes not marked to indicate that all conditions had been met, before they were published on the HPC website. The Panel agreed that the Executive should ensure that published reports were consistently marked.

Item 6.07/54 VISITORS' REPORTS

- 6.1 The Panel received a paper for discussion/approval from the Executive.
- 6.2 The Panel noted that the reports for programmes at Northumbria University were inconsistent in the delegation of panel members in attendance. The Panel agreed that the reports should be amended for consistency.

6.3 The Panel noted that the report for the Higher Education Diploma in Operating Department Practice at Edge Hill University included a condition relating to English language requirements in the admission criteria. The Committee noted that the HPC only required that students should graduate from the programme being able to communicate in English to the standard equivalent to level 7 of the International English Language Testing System. The Panel agreed that the condition should be amended to read that "The programme team should amend the statement within the admissions criteria to indicate that there is an English IELTs level to meet on entry." and that the reason should be amended accordingly.

Item 10.07/58 MINOR/MAJOR CHANGES: 1

Item 11.07/59 MINOR/MAJOR CHANGES: 2

11.1 The Panel received a paper for discussion/approval from the Executive.

Professor Lloyd did not participate in the discussion as she had a conflict of interest with the education provider.

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- 11.2 The Panel noted that the meeting of the Panel on 1 February 2007 had received a paper regarding a major/minor change submission from the University of Derby. Visitors assessing the occupational therapy programme had recommended that a proposed relocation was a major change and an approvals visit was required. However, Visitors assessing the radiography programme had recommended that the relocation was a minor change. The Panel on 1 February had agreed the Executive should notify the Visitors of the conflicting decisions and ask them to provide more information on the reasons for their recommendation, to decide whether a visit was needed.
- The Panel noted that the difference of opinion mainly related to the fact that the two programmes were to be relocated to different sites. The occupational therapy Visitors felt that they had received insufficient information about the proposed sites for the occupational therapy programme, the specialist facilities and how students would operate across sites. The radiography Visitors acknowledged that the programme had undergone a major change but there was still no requirement to visit.
- The Panel agreed that, in line with the Visitors' recommendation, the BSc (Hons) Diagnostic Radiography programme at the University of Derby had undergone a major change and that the programme continued to meet the SETs. There was no requirement for an approval visit to that programme.

Action: AC (by 5 July 2007)

The Panel agreed that, in the line with the Visitors' recommendation, the BSc (Hons) Occupational Therapy programme at the University of Derby had undergone a major change and that an approval visit was required to confirm that the programme continued to meet the SETs. The focus of the visit would be SET 3 (programme management and resource standards).
