 The reviewers noted that the changes were appropriate and well argued. Observations were made in relation to two modules: HCDI 11031 Child Language Development. Although the introductory material suggests that there might be nursery visits, this did not form part of the module descriptor. HCDI 30400 Clinical Practice. It is suggested that an equivalence between session and hours is provided; the 30 credit hours might attract 300 rather than 240 hours of student effort
