- To teach the existing Podiatry undergraduate module in Pharmacology to Post-Registration HPC Podiatry Registrants (course members)
- To assess pharmacology competency of course members
- To inform the E&TC of HPC of the names of those course members who have been successful in all elements of the Post-Registration Pharmacology module

- 4.1 The learning outcomes must ensure that those who successfully complete the programme meet the Standards of Proficiency for their part of the Register.

The visitors require a reference to be added within the learning objectives to the Medicines for Human Use (Administration and Sale or Supply) (Miscellaneous amendments) Order, October 2006 (Statutory Instrument 2006 / 2807; from 17.11.06)

**Reason:** The documentation omits reference to this important change that increased Access and Supply to POMs by Podiatrists

3.8 The facilities needed to ensure the welfare and well-being of students must be both adequate and accessible.

The visitors require an outline timetable for the stand-alone Pharmacology Module

**Reason:** The documentation specifies the point in the undergraduate programme when the module is delivered (i.e.: Year 3, Term 1), but it does not indicate how often nor for how long the Part-Time Post-Registration course member will have to attend, to complete the taught element of the module.

#### 3.2 The programme must be managed effectively

The visitors require an indication of the delivery and resourcing of the taught programme to Post-Registration course members

**Reason:** The documentation is unclear whether the Post-Registration module is a truly stand-alone module (and thus taught and resourced separately to the Under-Graduate Module) or whether both Under-graduate and Post-Registration students will be taught together and learning resourced from within the existing Under-Graduate budget.

### 6.2 Assessment methods must be employed that measure the learning outcomes and skills that are required to practise safely and effectively.

The visitors require clarification of the duration of the written examination

**Reason:** The documentation notes the written examination as 1.5 hours duration in the Module Descriptor and 2.5 hours duration in the Module Handbook, P 9.

## 6.2 Assessment methods must be employed that measure the learning outcomes and skills that are required to practise safely and effectively.

The visitors require an alternative example to Part B written examination SAQ 6

**Reason:** Some COX2 inhibitors (e.g.: VIOXX) have been withdrawn, due to their links to heart attack, and there is some indication that use of other NSAIDs may also be limited in the near future due to adverse patient side effects
