8.4 The Panel noted that the use of the term 'Visitor' followed the term used in the Health Professions Order 2001. The Panel noted that Partners sometimes made decisions about programmes based on documentation (e.g. in the annual monitoring process and major change process). In those circumstances, the Panel suggested that it might be appropriate to use a different term, to make it clear that a visit had not been held.

#### Item 9.07/147 Annual monitoring audits for approval

- 9.1 The Panel received a paper for discussion/approval from the Executive.
- 9.2 The Panel noted that, as part of the monitoring of programmes, education providers in group A were expected to complete an audit form and submit it with their internal quality reports and external examiners' reports from the last two academic years. Four annual monitoring assessment days had been held for Visitors to consider submissions.
