Head of Education - Report to Education and Training Committee, September 2008

Approval process

2007-2008 academic year

The Department has spent the summer months finalising the majority of the work from the last academic year's approval visits. 80 programmes were visited during the 2007-08 academic year (over 37 visits). 62 of these programmes will have had their programme approval/re-approval confirmed ahead of the start of the 2008-09 academic year. Of the remaining 18 programmes, 6 are due to be considered at the October meeting of the Education and Training Panel (this includes 3 new programmes which have been advised to delay their intake until approval is confirmed). This leaves 12 programmes to be considered at a later date; all of which already have existing HPC approval.

In summary, this means that 78% of programmes have been approved/re-approved ahead of the start of the new 2008-09 academic year. This is considerably less than the same time last year, when 96% of all approval visits had been concluded. This difference in outcome can be attributed to two main factors. The first relates to the type of education providers and the second to our system of open ended approval.

In the 2007-08 academic year, the Department visited nine ambulance trusts. None of these education providers deliver programmes in line with the traditional academic year cycle, therefore there is no requirement to complete the approval process before the start of the next academic year. Of the 18 programmes still meeting their conditions, 11 fall into this category.

This year, a small number of education providers have queried the deadline to meet their conditions through their observations to their visitors' report. In all cases, the education providers have asked for a longer deadline to meet the conditions, due to either the nature of the conditions or necessary collaboration with key stakeholders. Following legal advice, the Education and Training Panels have

agreed to later deadlines where the programmes already have HPC approval. The system of open ended approval essentially means that there is scope for Education and Training Panels to agree, in exceptional circumstances, to a conditions deadline into the next academic year, or after the next cohort has begun.

2008-2009 academic year

The Department has finalised a number of approval visits for the new academic year over the summer months.

The Department now has 27 visits scheduled for the new academic year (Sept 08 – July 09), covering 50 programmes. The schedule is now closed from Sept 08 – Feb 09, as we require six months notice. Education providers will have until December 2008 to request a visit before July 09. The detailed schedule is below.

Annual monitoring process

The Department has spent the summer months finalising the work from the last academic year's annual monitoring cycle.

118 audit submissions and 139 declaration forms were received in the 2007-08 academic year. 99% of these audit submissions have been considered by visitors and signed off by Education and Training Panels. Out of the 118 programmes, 115 had their approval reconfirmed, with just 3 programmes (3%) requiring a follow up approval visit.

The Department is currently preparing for the next round of annual monitoring. The publication 'annual monitoring – supplementary information for education providers' has been updated and copies of the new publication are due into the Department shortly. All approved programmes will be sent this publication, along with a tailored letter that outlines their specific requirements in the new academic year. It is anticipated that the peak workload will occur between January – July 2009.

Major change process


The Department has spent the summer months working on a relatively high number of major change submissions. Since March 2008 (when the revised major change process became effective), 43 submissions have been received, covering 93 programmes. The table below shows the specific submissions.

In the revised process, there is a notification stage and so not all submissions continue through to the full major change process. Some are filtered out and directed to the approval or annual monitoring process, if more appropriate. The figures below detail the decisions since 1 March 2008.

These figures continue to be encouraging as the process was revised to ensure that submissions were dealt with more effectively. Approximately half of submissions have avoided using the full major change process since March 2008; which under the former process would have had to be considered resulting in an extra cost and an extra burden on the education provider.

Out of these 30 submissions in the full major change process, 16 (53%) have been concluded and 14 (47%) are ongoing. 27

Publications

The Department has begun work on three publications. The 'Approval process – supplementary information for education providers' and 'Annual monitoring process – supplementary information for education providers' publications are having their content updated and their design brought in line with the new house style and visual identity. The Department is planning to have the final publications ready in mid autumn 2008, for mailing out to education providers for the 2008-09 academic year. Initial work has also begun on the third annual report, which will cover the 2007-08 academic year. The final publication should be available in early 2009.

Education provider presentations

The Department has begun work on the series of annual presentations to education providers. Six presentations are planned across the UK between October – December 2008. These presentations will update education providers on developments at HPC and in the Education Department specifically. Unlike previous years, these presentations will also include workshop sessions to

allow education providers to discuss and feedback on our standards and processes.

Partners

The Department has successfully recruited and trained new occupational therapist (clinicians), paramedic, prosthetist, radiographer and dietitian visitors over the summer months. The Department now has 141 trained visitors, which is sufficient for the estimated workload in the forthcoming academic year.

A programme of refresher training for all existing visitors begun in early September. It is hoped that approximately 60 visitors will attend refresher training sessions during this financial year. The remaining visitors will undergo refresher training in the 2009-10 financial year. Verbal feedback to date has been positive about the refresher training sessions.

Projects

Over the two months, the Department has shifted their focus to some of the project work outlined in the work plan for 2008-09.

The table below provides an update on the progress to date for each of the projects. Of the 20 projects, one has been completed and the remaining 19 are ongoing. In general, the projects are

slightly behind the proposed timescales agreed at the Education and Training Committee meeting in March 2008. The changes in resources (created by the new Department structure as well as staffing changes) coupled with the number of approval visits to independent education providers has seen a more intense and longer concentration of operational work into the summer months, which has impacted on the start of the project work. The timescales of individual projects were revisited in August 2008 and it is hoped that the majority of the projects will still be complete by the end of March 2009. Prioritisation has been given to the projects which link in with the delivery of our key operational processes (e.g. professional body programmes, IHCD paramedic programmes & Netregulate programme list) and those which affect our relationships with key stakeholders (e.g. list of approved programmes and results from recent consultations).




- Report writing and note-taking August 2008 (refresher course – aimed primarily at those drafting and proof-reading visitors' reports)
