#### Issues of Relevance to HPC

Following the reorganisation of the HEA the role and future of the advisory groups is under question. As yet there is no final decision about the group's future and this is likely to be made following the report of the audit/research by Prof. Dorothy Whittington on the HEA's possible routes of communication under the new structure.

Craig Mahoney, the HEA's new CEO addressed the group and discussed the shift in direction and structure of the HEA. He talked of the removal of Subject Centres, unless these were self-financing and the implications of this on staff involved, along with the implications for the advisory groups. Most appointments to the new structure's posts have now been made (AT was involved in an appointment panel on 20<sup>th</sup> June) and the subject directors now need to consider the most fruitful relationship with a range of organisations including PBs, regulators etc who are currently represented through the advisory boards. Craig was also aware that several groups were unrepresented in their liaison with the HEA including National Teaching Fellows, PVCs etc. There is also need for performance indicators in relation to liaison with external groups in order to identify their added value to the organisation along with the ability of the HEA to define its unique relevance to higher education.
