**Education System Build Major Project** 

Executive summary and recommendations

#### Introduction

The purpose of this paper is to provide the Committee with an update on the progress of the Education System Build (ESB) major project since it's commencement in January 2013. This project follows on from the Education Systems and Process Review (ESPR) major project which ran from April 2011 to February 2013. As well as reviewing all of the existing systems and processes used by the Education Department, the ESPR project produced a business case and proposed solution for a new information system.

The preferred software solution is Microsoft Dynamics Customer Relationship Management (CRM) alongside Microsoft SharePoint, which will be integrated with the existing email system and link to Registration and Partners systems and the HCPC website. The ESB project intends to deliver a new information system and refined business processes to the Education Department.

#### **Progress report**

The project initiation phase commenced at the end of January 2013. A series of discovery workshops have been run by the external supplier as they seek to understand our business processes and requirements in more detail, identify software solutions and agree a design for the system and data model.

A proof of concept demonstration took place at the end of May 2013 and a series of technical design workshops will take place in June and July 2013 in order to gather more detailed system requirements.

The Project Initiation Document (PID) is due to be presented to the Executive Management Team in August 2013. The PID will define the detail of project delivery, the necessary quality of the products, how changes will be communicated and funded and the required activities needed to complete the project. Should the PID be approved the project will then enter the build phase when the new system and processes will be tested extensively prior to deployment.

The timelines for the project have been amended. The project initiation phase has been extended to August 2013 to include additional workshops with the external supplier. The proceeding phases have been adjusted accordingly.

The key phases for the project are:

1. Project initiation January – August 2013 2. Build and business change August – January 2014 3. Deployment January 2014 - March 2014

4. Close of project and business as usual **April 2014**
