Education System Build Major Project

Executive summary and recommendations

Introduction

The purpose of this paper is to provide the Committee with an update on the progress of the Education System Build (ESB) major project since its last meeting on 6 June 2013. The ESB project intends to deliver a new information system and refined business processes to the Education Department.

Progress report

The project initiation phase commenced at the end of January 2013. The external suppliers successfully demonstrated a system proof of concept in June. A series of technical design workshops have taken place throughout June and July 2013 in order for the suppliers to gather and further document detailed system requirements for review by the project board. The documents define the proposed system configuration and finalise the business's functional and technical requirements.

The external suppliers have submitted their statements of work which outline the cost and time required to complete the proposed system. The project board are reviewing these and finalising the documents which form the Project Initiation Document (PID). The PID will define the detail of the project delivery, the necessary quality of the products, how changes will be communicated and funded and the required activities needed to complete the project. It is anticipated that the PID will be presented to the Executive Management Team in September 2013. Should the PID be approved the project will then enter the build phase when the new system and processes will be tested extensively prior to deployment.

The timelines for the project have been amended. The project initiation phase has been extended to September 2013 due to supplier and project board availability. The proceeding phases have been adjusted accordingly. These are subject to change as part of the production of the PID.

The key phases of the project are currently:

1. Project initiation

2. Build and business change

3. Deployment

4. Close of project and business as usual
