SET 4 Curriculum standards

SET 4.2: The programme must reflect the philosophy, values, skills and knowledge base as articulated in the curriculam guidance for the profession.

Condition: Correct all references where the HPC has been incorrectly referenced as the author of learning outcomes. (Page 6 of Vol 1, and Page 2 of the Portfolio for Practice (AHPs).

Reason: The learning outcomes detailed in the documentation originated from the National Prescribing Centre, not the HPC.

RECOMENDATIONS

SET 5 Practice Placements standards

Set 5.12 A range of learning and teaching methods that respect the rights and needs of patients or clients and colleagues must be in place throughout practice placements

Recommendation: Strengthen the reference to, and requirements for, informed consent within the prescribing framework. As a subject it is only mentioned in introductory information.

Reason: Whilst it was clarified sufficiently for the visitors that it would be covered as a core element of the programme, it is suggested that it is more overtly referred to in the module descriptors.

SET 6 Assessment standards

SET 6.2 Assessment methods must be employed that measure the learning outcomes and skills that are required to practice safely and effectively.

Recommendation: During the visit the assessment strategy was greatly clarified. It is suggested that it is made much more explicit within the course documentation, (possibly the module descriptors), where and by what method the student is to be assessed against the learner outcomes.

Reason: The details provided within the programme specification document did require more explanation during the visit.

COMMENDATIONS

The Visitors were impressed with the level of support offered to students by the library services of the university, in particular the postal services available to students.

Decision of the HPC Visitors

The nature and quality of instruction and facilities meets the Standards of Education and Training.

We recommend to the Education and Training Committee of the HPC that they approve this programme (subject to any conditions being met).
